WHAT IS SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE?

The Future Simple tense is used to talk about actions or events that will happen in the future.

Structure:

- **Positive:** Subject + will + base verb
 - *She will attend the meeting tomorrow.*
 - *They will receive their documents next week.*
- **Negative:** Subject + will not (won't) + base verb
 - *He will not leave the country next month.*
 - *We will not stop fighting for our rights.*
- **Question:** Will + subject + base verb?
 - *Will you apply for the job?*
 - *Will she need legal assistance?*

Common Uses:

- Making predictions: *The new law will help many migrants.*
- Expressing decisions: *I will learn English to improve my chances.*
- Making promises: *We will support you in this process.*
- Offering help: *The organization will assist refugees.*

Examples Related to Migrant Issues

1. *The government will provide new housing for migrants.*
2. *She will start a new job next month.*
3. *They will protest against unfair wages.*
4. *Will the lawyer help us with our case?*

5. *He will not return to his home country because of danger.*
6. *Will you attend the community workshop next Saturday?*
7. *We will fight for better working conditions.*

Tip:

- "Will" is used for all subjects (I, you, he, she, it, we, they).
- Use contractions: *will not* → *won't* (*He won't leave the country.*)
